

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA CENTER POINT, INDIANA **CAMP KRIETENSTEIN DINING HALL**



DESCRIPTION

This 8,200 square foot facility at Camp Krietenstein was completed in March 2014. The facility is a full service dining hall accommodating 250 people, a first aid center, and administrative offices for the Boy Scouts of America.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Working closely with the architect and the Boy Scouts of America, the project team developed a modern building design that encompasses all of the requirements of the Boy Scouts within their budget and schedule.

CHALLENGES

Constructing a commercial facility on a heavily wooded, remote site and combining new and old infrastructure systems to bring the camping facility up to modern technology. The construction of the facility had to be performed and completed between the end of one camping season and the start of the following camping season.
